A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

A

On Retreat

There is a minimum yearly standard for continuing education for every pastor who serves within the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. This standard is two weeks including two Sundays. This standard also includes a budget line item so that the pastor can afford to attend events that are designed to enrich and renew both the pastor and the congregation.

This standard is in place to create an expectation. For the pastor, it's the expectation that they will take the time to grow in mind and soul. For the congregation, it's the expectation that they will insist that their pastor takes the time to better themselves which in turn betters the parish.

I take my two weeks every year. Over the last few years, I have found a good pattern that works for me. One week, I attend an event. This year, I attended an Evangelism Conference in Lincoln, Nebraska. The other week, I take a reading week. I read a variety of books that I have collected over the previous year.

It's important for Christian leaders to grow. But here's the deal, I'm not the only Christian leader at First Lutheran Church. I have a team of people who serve with me. The staff also needs to grow. In fact, we are so committed to this principle that each First Lutheran job description has continuing education as one expectation for employment.

This is exactly why I facilitated a staff retreat this year. From August 6 through August 8, the staff of First Lutheran Church was on retreat together in Galena, Illinois.

Our facilitator was Pr. Greg Bouvier. Pr. Greg serves as the executive pastor of Sheridan Lutheran Church in Lincoln, Nebraska. Sheridan Lutheran is the largest congregation in the Nebraska Synod of the ELCA. Before attending the retreat, all of us read the book *Leadership and Self Deception* by the Arbinger Institute. Pr. Greg is a twenty year friend who provided his services free of cost to our parish.

Pr. Greg had three sessions on Spiritual Leadership. Each session lasted two or three hours where we looked at our own individual hearts and how we function as a team. Yet another session was facilitated by Pr. Greg and our congregational president, Dan Brudos. In that session, we assessed our strengths, weaknesses and future goals as a staff.

There was also time for us to get to know one another. In addition to our current staff, we are welcoming three new people to our team. This retreat helped us to get to know each other better.

Lastly, we gathered for worship. Before we left, we gathered for Word and Sacrament. I lead the service, while Pr. Greg preached. We prayed for you as you were praying for us.

This was an important event for the life of First Lutheran Church. This retreat gave the space for the staff to grow in their faith, to assess our ministry, to deepen our relationships and to grow in our leadership. All this and more occurred, simply because we went on retreat together.

And do you know who will benefit the most from the staff retreat? That's right! God's people will benefit the most! As the staff of First Lutheran Church intellectually, spiritually, organizationally and emotionally grows, the ministry of First Lutheran Church is strengthened. I rejoice that I serve a parish that takes seriously the growth of its leaders.


