On Wednesday, March 1, the church around the world celebrates Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the season of preparation for Holy Week. This year, our Lenten journey includes the pastors of Messiah Lutheran Church in Aledo, Cambridge Lutheran Church, Cambridge, St. Paul Lutheran Church in Orion and First Lutheran Church in Geneseo. Two Lenten fellowship opportunities will also be offered each week. Everyone is invited to join us for our Lenten Soup & Salad Luncheon following the Noon service or for the Faithtime Dinner from 5-6:15 p.m. Watch your mailboxes for FLC's Lent Brochure detailing all opportunities.

From Pastor Laura...

“... you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever.” (*ELW Rite of Holy Baptism*)

As I write, it seems as though Christmas has barely passed, and yet it is time in the church for us to prepare for Lent. Lent will begin this year on March 1, with our Ash Wednesday worship. But Pastor Matt, myself, Linda, and the ministry teams have already been thinking about our 2017 Lenten journey as a congregation for many weeks. As we prepare ourselves once more for the intensity and passion of remembering Christ’s betrayal, crucifixion, burial, and resurrection, we want to be sure our congregation is ready to follow where God is leading us as disciples (followers of our teacher, Jesus) and apostles (those who are sent out to tell others about Jesus).

We will embark on Marked Living: “Caretakers of the Promise,” our Lenten journey, on Ash Wednesday, as we receive that cross of ashes on our foreheads and are reminded once again of our identity as God’s beloved children. We bear that cross – the mark of Christ – throughout our lives. Even on the other 364 days of the year when it’s not visible to the outside world, it is visible to God, and, I hope, to each other.

So we live as “marked” people: set apart by God for God’s holy purposes. We are caretakers of God’s promise – that we have been saved by grace through faith. That Jesus Christ, in his dying and rising again to new life, brings us with him into resurrected living. And that this is a promise extended to all people, God’s whole beloved world.

We will spend the weeks of Lent hearing God’s Word for us, God’s marked people. We will explore together how God is inviting us to be caretakers of God’s grace. Where is God calling us, as a congregation, and where is God calling you, as an apostle? Each week, we will consider specific opportunities for ministry in the congregation. We will also lift up ways that our congregation can partner with others who share our work as caretakers of God’s promise.

Even though Lent is still a month away, we ask for your prayers now. Pray for me and Matt and Linda, your called leaders, as we prepare what we hope are meaningful and enriching worship experiences for Lent. Pray for the staff, our partners in ministry week in and week out. Pray for the congregation Council and the ministry teams, as we prepare for the season. And pray for yourself, that the Holy Spirit will assure you of God’s promise of grace and make you into a faithful caretaker of that promise.

Grace Notes from Linda Schmidt, Deacon

Deacon...you may have noticed that my title has changed. I have been an Associate in Ministry in the ELCA for 29 years. At the churchwide ELCA assembly last August, a change was made. Associates in Ministry, Deaconesses, and Diaconal Ministers—all lay rostered leaders—are now officially “deacons”. The hope is that this might provide clarity as to what deacons are and do. It also aligns us with other denominations who use this term. I am called here at First Lutheran, but I am rostered in the Northern Illinois Synod and in the ELCA. Deacons go through a Candidacy process, very similar to pastors. We take a minimum of 22 credit hours of religion classes (*I had a minor in religion at Luther College*), are teamed with a mentor, attend synod-sponsored retreats, undergo psychological testing, fill out a lot of paperwork!, and meet with the Candidacy Committee. Deacons are called to Word and Service. My service area, of course, is

worship and music. Other deacons serve in the areas of Christian education, youth, administration, chaplaincy, etc.

Service of Healing available for those who desire it at all 3 services on February 11-12. If you would like to be anointed with oil for healing, simply come to the stations after you commune.

Transfiguration Sunday

River City 6 will be leading our worship on Sunday, February 26 at one 9:30 a.m. service (*come for preservice music at 9:15*). This is Transfiguration Sunday—the last Sunday before Lent. There will also be a meal and auction sponsored by our youth following the service.


