Ash Wednesday ~ February 14, 2018

Holy Communion & Imposition of Ashes

Services at Noon & 6:30 p.m.

On Wednesday, February 14, the church around the world celebrates Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, the season of preparation for Holy Week. This year, our Lenten journey includes the pastors of Augustana Lutheran Church in Andover, Cambridge Lutheran Church in Cambridge, Messiah Lutheran Church in Port Byron, Peace Lutheran Church in Port Byron, St. Paul Lutheran Church in Orion and First Lutheran Church in Geneseo. Two Lenten fellowship opportunities will also be offered each week. Everyone is invited to join us for a simple soup lunch following the Noon service or for the Faithtime Dinner from 5-6:15 p.m. Watch your mailboxes for FLC's Lent & Holy Week Brochure detailing all opportunities.

Preparation

As we approach the church season of Lent, which begins on February 14 (*Ash Wednesday*) this year, we are again in the mode of preparation for the forty-day season. There is always a lot to prepare for in the life of the church, but in Lent it always seems as if there is more. I don't know about you, but I like to be as prepared as I can be, because there are just some things it is better to be prepared for, like when it's my turn to preach. I want and need to be prepared to preach not only for the congregation's sake, but for mine. It is always better to be prepared and the season of Lent is a time of preparation. The question is, what are we preparing for?

Originally in the ancient church Lent was a time to prepare for baptism. It was a forty-day long time of fasting and prayer after a three-year long catechumenate process. This is where the person who was desiring to be baptized would during the three-year process undergo serious instruction, examination, judgments about moral conduct, and fasting, which would culminate with baptism at the Vigil of Easter. Only adults were baptized by full immersion in the ancient church. Now, three years seems like a long time to take to prepare for baptism, but that is what they did. The reason was to help the person who was desiring to be baptized unlearn the ways of the world, and learn the Way of Jesus. If you think about it, learning the Way of Jesus, truly is a life-long process and pursuit. Learning to love neighbors and enemies, leaving your life behind, sharing your treasure, selflessly caring for the poor, giving up your possessions, would take more than three years to learn and live. It would take our entirety of our lives to learn and this is what we are called to do together, learn the Way of Jesus.

During this season of Lent our mid-week worship will focus on the readings from the Easter Vigil which will guide us through creation, the flood, deliverance at the Red Sea, salvation offered freely for all, and deliverance from the fiery furnace. All of the readings and messages will point us to what God has done and is doing through Jesus Christ and how we are called through our baptisms to work toward the healing of the world. We are called to prepare ourselves for the journey of faith, following Jesus' journey toward the cross and resurrection. We again will be sharing this time of worship with the Andover Cluster where we will hear different voices from different pastors each Wednesday. We hope you will join us for worship, food, and fellowship.

You are invited to be a part of the preparation. As we look inside ourselves and make the return to God who is the source of all goodness, may we be inspired to learn how to follow. May we prepare ourselves to walk and live the Way of Jesus and in so doing, prepare the world for Him to come again. Amen.

We also worship together, hear from our synod and churchwide leaders, and attend workshops on a variety of aspects of congregational life. The voting members of Synod Assembly include the rostered leaders under call in the synod and lay members from each congregation of the synod. Congregations are allowed a certain number of voting members based on their membership total. First Lutheran Church can send up to four lay voting members, plus one additional lay voting member who is a youth or young adult (*confirmed and under age 30*). Seminary Update from Catherine Nelson

My first semester at seminary was one to remember. There were many things that I enjoyed my first semester at the Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary. While being back in school after a year took some getting used to, I enjoyed all my course work.

Last semester I was in five classes: Hebrew, Teaching Parish, New Testament Survey, Church History 1, and Introduction to Theological Thinking. Being able to read, write, and speak in a foreign language is something I had never been able to do before. This class not only helped me get back into the swing of studying and working hard to get the good grades I desire, but it also boosted my confidence in my own skills.
