# *March's Message*

By the time you read this, we will already be deep into the season of Lent. Lent is a time of repentance, which literally means “turning around.” We turn from our sins in this penitential season; we confess to God those things we’ve done for which we seek forgiveness. We turn out from ourselves (*Martin Luther liked to talk about sin as the tendency to curve in one oneself*) to consider the needs of others. We turn from idols (*money, power, prestige*) to the one true God. We turn from our rebellious ways to seek the harmony that God intends for us.

The disciplines of Lent are designed to help us in our turning around. They are designed to align our focus with God’s desire for us – that we love God, love our neighbors, and love the world God has created.

Several of our congregation’s Lenten practices will help you on your journey. There will be periods of silence in some of our worship services, which can serve as time for self-examination and repentance (*the first discipline*). Our Wednesday midday meals will be simple: homemade soups and bread. Nourishing food, but nothing extravagant or overly rich. For those who are fasting during the season (*the second discipline*), we hope that these meals reflect your efforts. Finally, sacrificial giving and works of love (*the third discipline*) are on our hearts and minds throughout the season. Consider making a special gift to World Hunger or one of our congregation’s special funds. Consider saying “yes” when I or Pastor Matt call you and ask you to help out at church in a new role!

This is a busy time of the year in the life of the church (*22 worship services in the month*

*of March!*) and our desire as we plan these opportunities is that you are continually renewed, refreshed, and motivated to continue on the journey to Easter.

March will also be the beginning of our transition on the church staff. We will prepare to celebrate the ministry of three of our staff members: Sherry Dickens, Pastor Lynn Bergren, and Pastor Virgil Juliot [and later in the year, Lynn Lindell]. Each of them offer so many gifts to this congregation. We are not losing them as members of Christ’s body with us, or as members of this congregation, but we are losing their contributions in particular ways as staff members. Pastor Matt and I and the rest of the staff will miss their presence among us throughout the week. And all of us, as a congregation, will have to learn new ways of doing the work that God calls us to, as tasks shift and responsibilities are reassigned.

I hope you will take the time to send a note or a card, or simply say “thank you,” to those on staff who will be concluding their ministry this month. Let them know that they are appreciated. Let each of them know how they have touched your lives with their ministry.

As Easter morn approaches, we look for the resurrection of Jesus. Jesus is the source of all our hope and life. We know that Jesus brings new life out of death. So, we go forward as disciples, not knowing exactly where we go, but confident that God is leading us, that Jesus is walking alongside us, and the Holy Spirit will blow us in the right direction.
