Right now, our life is full of blessings and changes and challenges. Within our First Lutheran family, we are blessed as we welcome some new members into the life of the congregation. Tricia Fuelling, who has been a part of our family for a while now, is making it official, and we welcome two families who are new to our community into our congregation: The Copersmets and the Palaskis. Please take the time to greet and welcome Mark & Mary Copersmet and Don & Kelly Palaski.

Several new babies have been born (or are expected soon!). We welcomed Jack Hutchinson through the sacrament of Holy Baptism. And quite a few of our members are celebrating new grandbabies! God is good.

As our family grows, we also mourn the loss of those who have died. Jack Carius passed away, and he now joins the great cloud of witnesses who surround God's throne and sing God's glory.

Our new faith formation program, GIFT (*Growing In Faith Together*) has enjoyed early successes and also some challenges. The winter weather seems to hit us hard each time the weekend rolls around (and sometimes every day in between, too), and so just getting to church on the weekends has proven challenging for many! But we have persisted, and each weekend gathered for study and fellowship and growth in faith. We have over 40 adults participating in our small group Bible studies and about 20 children and 7 teachers leading our children/youth Sunday morning

curriculum, Whole People of God. As we move into March, some group leaders and teachers will shift responsibilities, and we hope to always include more participants, so that as we grow in faith as disciples, we also grow the number of disciples among us!

In addition to all that is happening in our church family, the Kamprath family has been blessed with our first foster care placement. We welcomed Haile into our family at the end of January (in the midst of piles of snow and record low temperatures and days upon days of school cancellations). Haile is 11 years old and is a 5<sup>th</sup> grader at Northside. She comes to us from the QCA, and so we pray that in addition to welcoming her into our church family at First, we are also able to make her feel welcome in Geneseo and adjust to small town living. And, as is usually the case in foster care, we don't know exactly how long Haile will be living with us, but we do know that she is now a part of our family. We have been blessed by her placement in our home, and we pray that in turn, we may be a blessing in her life.

Please continue to pray for our church family, and we also humbly ask for your prayers for myself and Matt and Haile and Anna.

April’s book title is *As Bright as Heaven* by Susan Meissner. In 1918, Philadelphia was a city teeming with promise. Even as its young men went off to fight in the Great War, there were opportunities for a fresh start on its cobblestone streets. Into this bustling town, came Pauline Bright and her husband, filled with hope that they could now give their three daughters--Evelyn, Maggie, and Willa--a chance at a better life. But just months after they arrive, the Spanish Flu reaches the shores of America. As the pandemic claims more than twelve thousand victims in their adopted city, they find their lives left with a world that looks nothing like the one they knew. But even as they lose loved ones, they take in a baby orphaned by the disease who becomes their single source of hope. Amidst the tragedy and challenges, they learn what they cannot live without--and what they are willing to do about it.
