Sleepless in Geneseo

One of my favorite psalms is Psalm 121 (*"I lift up my eyes to the hills..."*). Verses 3 & 4 have been by refrain for the last 13 weeks. *The LORD will not let your foot be moved nor will the one who watches over you fall asleep. Behold, the keeper of Israel will neither slumber nor sleep.*

It has been a comfort to me to know that when I'm up at all hours of the night with the baby, I'm not alone. God is awake, too, keeping watch over all God's children.

Many of you have asked me, since Noah was born, "Are you getting any sleep?" or even, "Is he sleeping through the night yet?" The answer to both of those questions is "No." If you catch me yawning during one of Pastor Matt's sermons, it's simply because I'm exhausted. It's a blessed exhaustion, though, and one that I wouldn't trade for the world.

If I'm lucky, I'm only roused from sleep once in the middle of the night by hungry cries. As I feed my child, I thank God that I have what Noah needs, that I can satisfy his hunger. Soon enough, he will fall back asleep, and I will, too.

The Psalmist knew that God hears the cries of God's children all the time. And despite the fact that God is continually and consistently bestowing blessings upon us, our hungry cries never cease. There are always those among us who cry out in need – in need of food, in need of healing, in need of justice, in need of peace, in need of love. God hears our cries, at any hour of the day or night, as God keeps watch over us all.

This Lent, we have the chance to respond to the cries of our brothers and sisters with the same loving attention that God gives. We will participate in Lutheran World Relief's efforts to assemble and distribute Personal Care Kits (*see page 4 for more information*). A few simple items can bring a much-needed sense of dignity to those who are fleeing violence or recovering from natural disasters. A bar of soap and a toothbrush can be just what's needed to bring comfort after what may have been many sleepless nights for those fleeing a war zone. A clean towel and a comb provide for basic human needs in the nightmare that is the aftermath of an earthquake, wildfire, or hurricane. The recipient of these items may be able to sleep soundly, for a few hours at least, while God remains vigilant through the night.

A Season of Hope

Lutheran World Relief has developed a special program for the 2020 Lenten Season. Our congregation will walk with people around the world afflicted by war, displacement and poverty by collecting and assembling LWR Personal Care Kits. Those assembled kits will then be sent to distributing centers and provided to those in need. When natural disaster strikes or political conflict flares, families have little chance to gather their belongings before fleeing danger. They arrive at a refugee camp, or other place of safety, scared, vulnerable and dirty from travel. The simple items in a Personal Care Kit allow them to wash away dirt, sweat and germs with the fresh scent of soap and the softness of a towel, reminders of someone's care and concern for them in their plight.

- First Lutheran's goal for the 2020 Lenten *Season of Hope* will be 70 Personal Care Kits! As in the past, Personal Care Kits will include a *towel, 2-3 bars of soap, a sturdy comb, nail clipper and a toothbrush*. Watch for a display on the bulletin board in the Fellowship Room for details regarding these items. A complete set, ready for assembly, can be purchased for under \$10. Collection will begin on Ash Wednesday, February 26. Please leave items in the basket outside the church office.

Outreach Ministry's Volunteer Recognition

Faithtime Kids (*Wednesdays Afterschool*)

The Orange Curriculum Focus for March is entitled “*Forgiveness Is Up to You.*” This month, children will begin to understand how forgiveness starts with us and the bottom line is that we should treat others the way we want to be treated. Some of the stories featured this month include: The Unmerciful Servant, Zacchaeus, and the Lost Son.

An important component of Faithtime is memorizing Bible verses. Some of us may question why it is important for our children to learn memory verses. The Bible gives us many reasons to make scripture reading a priority. Here are a few of them:

- It helps us love and encourage others (*Hebrews 10:24; 2 Timothy 4:2*).

Council Highlights from February 17, 2020

Action Items

Multiple funding requests were approved:

- \$1000 from Local Benevolence for Lutheran Outdoor Ministries Center to assist children financially to attend camp.
- \$105 from Called Staff Continuing Education plus mileage for Pastors to attend Ministry Development workshops on February 20, 2020 and March 31, 2020.
- Up to \$150 from Lay/Staff Development for church members to attend the Kishwaukee Resourcing Event on March 14, 2020.
- \$676.25 from Lay/Staff Development for Morgan Sarber to attend the Area 8 Handbell Festival and Conference in June.
- Morgan Sarber requested work time be used to attend the Via de Christo Weekend on March 26-29 in lieu of worship.

Mission Endowment brought 3 requests to Council for approval:

- \$1000 for Another Child Foundation for support of new ministry partners.
- \$1000 for Claire Yerkey to do mission work in Puerto Rico as part of The Navigators.
- \$1000 for Rebuilding Together to build a new facility in Atkinson

Old Business

- We have applied for a tax exemption for the former rental property and garage.

- Finance Ministry continues to work through the audit report, and is preparing a document that will identify and explain all accounts.

New Business

As part of an ongoing assessment of the worship schedule, information on maximum capacity for the sanctuary is 320, which includes the balcony and overflow areas.

- Summer worship will again be 5:30 on Saturday and 9:30 on Sunday, from Memorial Day weekend to Labor Day weekend.
- Representatives from the church met with Cambridge Lutheran Church in a conversation about the future of Cambridge Lutheran Church. We will continue to meet while they decide a course of action.
