# Your Invited!

We're getting ready for another great program year at First! There is a lot of excitement and anticipation in the air here, thanks to the Holy Spirit. We've had a great summer, with Spirit-filled worship, lots of special music, Vacation Bible School, Music Camp, youth events, yoga, Theology on Tap, and a new adult education opportunity on Sunday mornings. Now, it's time to get ready for Glory Ringers, Sanctuary Choir, praise team rehearsals, Preschool, Faithtime, Confirmation, high school youth group, Wednesday evening and Sunday morning adult education classes, First Book Club, First Friends. As we move into fall, Monday morning Bible Study and Children's Church continue each week, faithful and steadfast. Quilting and Women's Bible Study continue their work each month. We return to our regular worship schedule on the weekend of September 9 & 10.

With the start of a new program year, I invite you to consider how God is calling you to serve God and your neighbor in this place. We are all part of God's mission to Share Christ's Love with each other, our community, and the world. What are some of the ways that you can plug in to God's mission? What particular gifts and interests has God given you? Some areas where your service is especially needed:

**As a Faithtime volunteer.**

- We need drivers to bring the kids from school to church. You need a valid driver's license, reliable car, and insurance, and must be available on Wednesdays from 3-3:45 p.m.
- We need teachers and shepherds. Teachers will stay with their class for Motion, Games, and Music, and also teach their class for the Message rotation. Shepherds will stay with their class during the full rotation while one of the Pastors teaches the Message. You must be available each Wednesday from 3:45-5:30 p.m.

- We need leaders for the Motion rotation, which includes drama, crafts, service projects, and more. You can commit for several weeks at a time rather than the entire program year.

**As a Nursery volunteer.**

Each Sunday morning, during worship, we need people to help care for our youngest members and guests. We hope to have enough teams that you will be scheduled once every 6 weeks to serve at either 8:30 or 10 a.m. One option is to volunteer for the service time opposite your usual attendance time, so that you can still attend and participate in worship each week.

**As an Altar Guild volunteer.**

As an Altar Guild volunteer. The Lord's Supper is central to our worship each week, as we gather around Word, wine, and wheat (*bread*) to worship. If you can set the table and wash the dishes at home, you can set the Table and wash the dishes at church, too! Consider volunteering as a family or with a friend. We will pair you with an experienced volunteer to teach you everything you need to know.

And, of course, there are so many other ways that you can offer yourself to God's service. We are so grateful for the hard work and dedication of all of our volunteers, who work with us for the sake of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ. Please contact me or Pastor Matt or the church office if you would like to try something new this year!

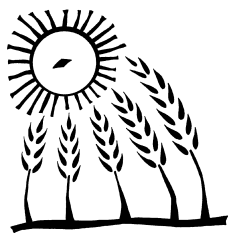

## **Confirmation (7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> graders)**

This year, we begin using an exciting new Confirmation curriculum called, “CoLABorate.” Each lesson confronts students with a real question about Bible, the church, or Lutheran doctrine, then equips students to make thoughtful decisions about how they might answer it. It is based on the idea that our job as teachers of the faith during these years is to help students think critically about and engage in meaningful ways with the Bible and their faith, rather than to give them all the answers. The 2017-2018 year is our Bible Year, so we will complete the Old Testament and New Testament units. 2018-2019 will be Catechism Year, so we will complete the Lutheran History & Catechism and Lutheran Living units. Each week, Pastor Laura or Pastor Matt will teach the lesson, and then the adult mentors will lead small group activities and games that reinforce the lesson. Here’s our schedule:

- October’s book title is *People of the Book* written by Geraldine Brooks. Inspired by a true story, *People of the Book* is a novel of sweeping historical grandeur and intimate emotional intensity by an acclaimed and beloved author. Called “*a tour de force*” by the *San Francisco Chronicle*, this ambitious, electrifying work traces the harrowing journey of the famed Sarajevo Haggadah, a beautifully illuminated Hebrew manuscript created in fifteenth-century Spain. When it falls to Hanna Heath, an Australian rare-book expert, to conserve this priceless work, the series of tiny artifacts she discovers in its ancient binding—an insect wing fragment, wine stains, salt crystals, a white hair—only begin to unlock its deep mysteries and unexpectedly plunges Hanna into the intrigues of fine art forgers and ultra-nationalist fanatics. Hurry and begin reading this bestselling novel that follows a rare manuscript through centuries of exile and war.
