# *Making Plans*

“For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart, I will let you find me, says the LORD...”

*Jeremiah 29:11-14a*

As I write, Anna is preparing to begin kindergarten. I feel prepared for this moment, mostly. We have our back-to-school outfit and school supplies. I’ve signed up for PTA and know what day I’m supposed to send snack. We’ve had lots of discussions about lunches, weighing benefits of hot lunch vs. cold lunch. But despite all of our family’s preparation, I still can’t help feeling a little bit anxious about the unknown.

In many ways, this mirrors how I feel about ministry at First Lutheran right now as we begin another program year. We’ve got the calendars set and the registrations are flowing in. The curriculum is ordered and our volunteers are getting ready. However, there is still so much unknown – Will we find the final few volunteers that we need? Will we be ready and welcoming when the kids pile in on the first day of Faithtime? Will those whom we’ve missed over the summer months return to weekend worship? Those unknowns always carry with them a bit of anxiety.

But having faith means trusting that, if we do our part (plan and invite and prepare), the Holy Spirit will do her part (growing faith and growing disciples). So I will trust.

And as we focus on the here and now, doing our best to have a great September, we are also planning for the next season. In January, we plan to introduce a new Christian education time to accompany weekend worship. As a congregation Council, we’ve been listening to the Holy Spirit and to you all, and we’ve heard the desire for a time on the weekends to engage in small groups,

Bible Study, and building community. Our Wednesday programming will remain in place, as it is integral to our mission of “*Sharing Christ’s Love*.” And to our existing programming, we will be adding small groups and children’s faith formation on Sunday mornings.

There is a lot happening in our congregation right now! There is so much to be excited about, accompanied by a dose of anxiety about the unknown. Amidst the joy and the worry, we trust that the Holy Spirit is at work among us, inspiring us with new ideas and renewed enthusiasm. And I take heart that, even when we don’t know exactly what the future looks like, God has got it under control.

Over the next 15 or so years he rose through the ranks to become Fire Chief in 1980—a position he held for 15 more years.

Even though its been 23 or so years since Jerry donned his turnout gear, he continues to speak very fondly of his years serving our community; those words coming with significant emotion—especially when recalling fires and vehicle crashes that claimed lives. But also when he talks about the clown troop he and his wife Virginia were part of—personal fun that brought smiles to thousands of faces.

When you see Jerry you see a man with a servant's heart.

## Stewardship: *Giving in Gratitude*

Stewardship teaches that all that we have and all that we are is a gift from God. We are the stewards - not only of our financial resources, but also of this created earth, our time, our talents, our families, our relationships, life itself, but most importantly of God's word. Christian stewardship is using these gifts God has given us, to do the work God is calling us to do. We put our financial gifts to work in a number of ways:

- *Annual Giving (ordinary stewardship)* is the regular practice of returning to God every year a portion of all that God has given us.
- *Capital Giving (extraordinary stewardship)* involves the special occasions that arise in the life of our church home that call us to give beyond our ordinary habit.
- *Legacy Giving (legacy stewardship)* is the way in which we address the matter of gifting the accumulations of our lifetime to strengthen our church and the other causes we care about.

How we use money says as much about our value system as anything we say and do. How we value it - hoard it - and spend it defines us. Who are you becoming? Who do you want to be? What is God calling you to do? Walk with us this fall as we explore God's calling in worship and in Bible readings through *Giving in Gratitude*.

We will be discussing the book, *Same Life, Different Story* by Christian life-coach, Jan Silvious. She attempts to straddle the worlds of the kitchen and big house, but her skin color will forever set her apart from Belle and the other slaves. Through the unique eyes of Lavinia and Belle, Kathleen Grissom's debut novel unfolds in a heartbreaking and ultimately hopeful story of class, race, dignity, deep-buried secrets, and familial bonds.
