A WORD FROM PASTOR MATT

Bread Upon Bread Upon Bread

I eat a lot of bread; toast, bagels, sandwich bread, Hawaiian bread, Italian bread, French bread, sourdough, tortillas, pitas, breadsticks, pretzels, pizza, cinnamon rolls, dinner rolls, and lots of communion wafers. Bread is an essential part of my life and diet. I would probably struggle taking bread and wheat out of my diet for I love the way it tastes. I like the comfort that bread provides.

Now, I know a lot of people don't eat bread for a lot of reasons; they either don't like the way it tastes, or they are cutting the carbs out of their diet, or they are completely removing the gluten from their diet because of an intolerance or allergy. There are also many who simply don't have enough bread to eat. Here in the United States, one in six children are affected by hunger. Globally, hunger is the biggest threat to people's health and well-being. Lack of access to bread or any food makes people angry and sometimes violent. Hunger causes wars and is used as a weapon. Lack of access to essential foods like bread creates suffering in our world.

Jesus talks a lot about bread for a reason. In the gospels Jesus feeds those who are hungry with bread. Jesus breaks bread with outsiders and insiders at tables of both the rich and poor. Jesus shows his disciples that his body broken will be the bread that they will eat for spiritual and physical communion with God. As essential as bread is to the table, so is Jesus to our world which longs to know a table that is not divided or broken, but restored and healed. A table where all are fed with bread and nourished.

Beginning July 28 through August 25, for five weeks in a row, we will be exploring the sixth chapter of the gospel of John which is all about Jesus as the bread of life. For five weekends we will explore how essential bread is to our worship life together. There will be an opportunity to bake the bread on July 21 that we will use in worship for Holy Communion. Our worship and music throughout the series will revolve around bread and table fellowship. Our noisy offerings for the month of July will go to Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry, and in August to ELCA World Hunger. By the end of the five Sundays, it will feel like bread upon bread upon bread and hopefully grace upon grace upon grace. Join us!

The Gospel according to Bread - July 28/29 - August 24/25

The last five weeks of the summer, our gospel readings come from John 6, the "I am the bread of life" chapter. Worship during this time will focus on Jesus as the bread of life and what this means for us and our world. We will have opportunities to make, eat, and share bread with others!

Good Samaritan Fund

Did you know that our congregation has a special fund called the Good Samaritan Fund? It is funded by designated donations, separate from the General Fund. The money in the Fund is used, at the discretion of the pastors, when there are people in need in our congregation and community. Past disbursements from the Fund have included partial rent payments, utility payments (mostly electricity), help with medical bills, filling up someone's gas tank or paying for a ride, and providing a meal or restaurant or grocery gift card. Some of the recipients of the funds have been members of our congregation; most are non-members. Some are our neighbors in Henry County, some folks are simply passing through Geneseo on their way somewhere else and need help. When someone contacts the church requesting assistance, we first direct them to the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry. There are occasions when the Food Pantry cannot meet a need, and then we may be able to help. On days when the Food Pantry is not open, this Fund also allows us to offer some immediate assistance. So far this year, we have made 6 disbursements, and currently the Fund is almost empty.
