

A WORD FROM BISHOP STACIE FIDLAR





The first question I asked people gathered for our Congregational Resourcing Event was this:

What's your favorite Bible story?

The answers came fast and furious, Hebrew Bible and New Testament. Good Samaritan. Woman at the Well. The resurrection. David and Goliath.

Now - tell me what that story has to do with your life. How does God's story of life and redemption and healing and reconciliation shape your life? Does that change the story - or how you think about it?

The arc of God's story with the beloved people of God's creation is long, but all along the way it is meant to shape us. That's why our ancestors recorded these stories in their minds and hearts and finally in writing. They wanted us to be shaped by them. They wanted us to learn from them. They wanted us to know deep within us how God's story never leaves us the same. God's story is meant to be transformative. It never leaves us the same.

That's why we are called as the people of God to be continually immersed in God's story. To open it in our lives and listen to how God is reaching out to us in this time and this place through the old, old story of love and life.

God's story, God's work through Jesus, is woven with your story. Your life is a story of redemption, time and again. Your life is a story of finding your authentic self, your home, your peace, in the heart of God's story. From the beginning of creation through the reconciling and healing work of Jesus and continually blowing through the Holy Spirit's nudging – God is always at work in you. On you. Among you.

Open God's Story in your life and listen. Open God's Story in your congregation – where is God's mission, Jesus' calling, leading you?

Synod Assembly 2024

The Thirty-Sixth Annual Northern Illinois Synod Assembly will be held on Friday, June 14 and Saturday, June 15 at Augustana College in Rock Island. Each congregation will send voting members to gather under the theme of Open God's Story. First Lutheran Church, Geneseo will be sending our Pastors and 3 lay voting members: Lendol Calder, Cindy Groene, and Jenn Stoeger.

To celebrate the 50th Anniversary of ELCA World Hunger, the Synod is encouraging congregations to have a food drive for local food pantries during the time that an in-kind offering would have been collected for Synod Assembly. (Here at First Lutheran, we will continue to collect items for the Geneseo-Atkinson Food Pantry.) The offering at the Festival Worship on Friday will be split between Lutheran Outdoor Ministries Center and ELCA World Hunger, both celebrating 50 years of ministry.

Instead, she bought a cast-off brown gelding named Tarzan, donned men's dungarees, and headed south in mid-November, hoping to beat the snow. Annie had little idea what to expect beyond her rural crossroads; she didn't even have a map. But she did have her ex-racehorse, her faithful mutt, and her own unfailing belief that Americans would treat a stranger with kindness. Council Highlights for May 20, 2024

- First Lutheran will be represented at the Northern Illinois Synod Assembly June 14-15 by Pastor Matt and Pastor Laura, Lendol Calder, Jenn Stoeger, and Cindy Groene.
- On recommendation from the Building & Property Ministry, we voted to recommend a bid from West Concrete for tearing out and replacing the parking lot on the South side of the church. As the bid exceeds \$15,000, per the church bylaws, a congregational meeting will be called in June to consider the expenditure.
- On a recommendation from the Finance Ministry, we approved a new Gift Policy to help ensure that First Lutheran Church will faithfully and properly manage and steward the assets and resources donated to its mission.
- Council approved the following funding requests: (1) \$250 from the Mission Endowment Fund for Emma Slaymaker and the Manna Project International (2) \$300 for Pastor Laura to participate in a 6-month coaching program as part of her Ministry Development.
