A WORD FROM PASTOR MATT

Let's Go and Get a Drink this Summer (and talk about God)

As the title of this newsletter article indicates, I am inviting you to come and get a drink with me this summer and talk about God. This is an invitation to both of the churches I serve. Ages ago, we used to gather often for times of fellowship and conversation at Geneseo Brewing Company for Theology on Tap. At these small group gatherings, where all are welcome, we shared a drink and grew in our relationships together as we explored Scripture, other faith traditions, books, and anything and everything that came up in the conversations. Well, let's do it again.

Now, the drink we can have together doesn't need to have alcohol, sugar, or carbonation in it, really that's entirely up to you what you want to drink. For me, it's more about people gathering and sharing in a time of fellowship and learning, than it is about the type of drink (or food) we are having together. The drink that we share together is just an opening for a conversation we can have about faith, life, and God in a public place.

Since Jesus ate and drank with everybody in public and in private, there must be something seriously holy about eating and drinking with people. Every single Sunday we replay and remember Jesus' last night, where he ate and drank with his friends. Food and drinks accompany most gatherings in the world and are the very elements that Jesus, and by extension we use, to share in God's promises. Eating and drinking together can become holy endeavors especially when our conversation moves past the shallows to the deep waters where God is leading us together. The promise is, that as we follow Jesus' invitation to the tables that have been prepared for us, we will find Jesus eating and drinking right beside us, even inside us.

As I said above, this is just an invitation, but it is one I hope you will accept. Come and see how when we talk about God openly, (theology) this opens us up to see God working in our own lives in profound and concrete ways. Come and see that how over a drink of your choosing we can grow in relationship with God and others. Come and see how sharing drinks together in a public place can be yet another expression of the table fellowship we practice every Sunday in worship.

Come and have a drink with me this summer every **fourth Wednesday** (May 22, June 26, July 24, & August 28) from 7-8:30 p.m. We will gather at Geneseo Brewing Company for another round of Theology on Tap. Join us! All are welcome!





Council Highlights for April 15, 2024

As we do at every meeting, the Council reviewed reports from the pastors, the Cabinet, and the various ministry teams at First Lutheran. Of these reports, perhaps the most significant this month concerns ministry to youth. A Youth Ministry Task Force has begun meeting to determine outcomes for the youth ministry program. After the task force settles on realistic outcomes, then it will consider what additional resources will be needed to achieve the kind of youth ministry we want to see at First Lutheran.

• Approved Tim Holmstrom to be a member of the Audit Committee. Tim joins Judi Denys and Jim Spence as they conduct an annual audit of First Lutheran Church's financial records and the internal controls of the congregation. The purpose of an audit is to provide an opinion on the reasonableness of the congregation's financial statements and to recommend improvements to its internal controls.

 Council approved the following funding requests: (1) \$3,000 for college scholarships for four members of First: Logan Palmer, Erik Bergren, Alex Slaymaker, and Emma Slaymaker. Congratulations to these hard-working, high achieving students! (2) \$750 from Social Ministry for Churches United of Quad City Area.


Women's Ministry Cover Girls Quilting
