### Godly Play: No Single Way To Learn

In Godly Play, our Faithtime Kids program for children ages K-5, we tell stories with multisensory materials to appeal to a broad range of learning styles: *auditory* because the story is spoken out loud; *visual*, because the handmade wooden figures represent what is happening in the story; *kinesthetic*, because the storyteller moves the materials around. Later, any child who wishes to learn to tell the tale can respond similarly. In "*response time*," those children who work best together can pair off or form groups to work on creative projects. Those who work best alone have the time and space to concentrate on projects by themselves. We gather the children in a circle for the storytelling, and at the end for a feast, because they thereby learn about being in a community and working together. Everything we do in Godly Play contributes to learning.

# Milestone Ministry ~ Welcoming Young Children to Worship: Sanctuary Crawl Event: Saturday, September 7 ~ 4:30-5:15 p.m.

Kindergarten children and their families learn about Worship at First! Kids can ask questions, explore the Sanctuary, and learn how they can be an important part of worship. Children will receive their stones during worship that evening.

## Worshiping Together

We hope you will join us the weekend of September 7 & 8 as we introduce a new intergenerational approach to worship. Instead of a distinct children's sermon time & message and traditional sermon, everyone will receive the same message—in a little bit different way. The message themes will span several weeks and change with the season of the church year. Our first theme will be Creation.

Children will still come forward as usual during the children's sermon and the pastor or Abbey will deliver a message based on that season's theme. This message is also applicable to adults and will complement the information they will hear in the traditional sermon. Once children return to their seats, they will have activities to work on related to the theme. Babies through pre-readers will have age-appropriate activities in the PRAYground on Sunday mornings. Older children will have lapboards with activities and supplies that they can take to their seats to work on. Lapboards will be available at both Saturday and Sunday worship.

## Blessing of the Harvest

With the upcoming harvest season, First Lutheran will be praying for the safety of all farmers, and for a bountiful harvest. Farmers are invited to bring a symbol of their harvest to be blessed during the worship services on October 5 & 6.

## Sacred Spaces: Healing

#### First Book Club

Come and join us for discussion on the content of the book *Lessons in Chemistry* and faith response to the author Bonnie Garmus on Thursday, September 19 at 2 p.m. in Grace Place.

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel-prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking ("combine one tablespoon acetic acid with a pinch of sodium chloride") proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy. Because as it turns out, Elizabeth Zott isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo. Laugh-out-loud funny, shrewdly observant, and studded with a dazzling cast of supporting characters, *Lessons in Chemistry* is as original and vibrant as its protagonist. This novel is "irresistible, satisfying and full of fuel" so be sure to read it and join our discussion!
