Top 5 Ways to be an Awesome Internship Congregation

By now, hopefully you've heard the good news that First Lutheran will host Madelyn Knutson as our pastoral intern beginning in August. She will serve in a pastoral role, but is not yet ordained, and so we will call her "Vicar Madelyn." (The title *vicar* is used in a variety of ways among Christian denominations, but within the Lutheran tradition, a vicar is a candidate for ordination, a pastor-in-training.) Here are some ways that we can work together to make this a great experience for everyone! 5. Introduce yourself to her. Tell her your name, and then do it again next time you see

- her. We only have one new person to meet she has 800.
- 4. Focus on Vicar Madelyn's gifts for ministry, not her age. It's true that she is young. However, it won't be particularly helpful for her to hear from 50 different people that she's young enough to be your daughter (or granddaughter). It will be helpful for her to receive honest feedback about her preaching, pastoral care, and leadership.
- 3. Expect to be challenged. Growing in faith involves asking questions that sometimes challenge our theological understanding. When this happens to you, be honest and patient with yourself about the challenges you are experiencing. When you see this happening with others, be kind and gentle.
- 2. Help us form an Internship Committee of dedicated disciples. We are seeking input from the whole congregation about who has the gifts to serve in this way. We want to form a committee that represents a variety of ages, genders, and backgrounds. If you are willing to serve, or if you would like to nominate someone to serve, please contact me soon. The Council will appoint this committee at our June 16 meeting.

1. Pray for Vicar Madelyn. Pray for her growth as a leader in God's church, and for her vocation to be affirmed by her ministry here. Pray for her health, and that of her family. Pray for me, as I learn how to be a good internship supervisor. Pray for the Internship Committee and our Staff, as we work with Vicar Madelvn.

As a congregation, we will work together to make the coming academic year one of learning, growth, and faithful discipleship for Vicar Madelyn and all of us.

Congregational leaders (those on the Finance Ministry and the Congregation Council) will be working in the coming months on securing the funding we will need for this venture. Madelyn will receive a modest monthly stipend for her work, and there are a few other expenses associated with the program. Since this was not anticipated when we developed and approved the 2025 budget, we will not have funds available in the General Fund until this coming January, when we begin a new budget year. For the months of August through December, the internship will be funded from several sources, including the Mission Endowment Fund, Memorial funds, and the Unbudgeted Projects Fund. We have been careful stewards in past surplus years, resulting in funds being available now for this ministry. Thanks be to God and the generosity of this congregation, our ministry is not limited because "it's not in the budget."

Stay tuned for more news in the coming months about how we will be welcoming Vicar Madelyn!

Women can be heroes. When twenty-year-old nursing student Frances "Frankie" McGrath hears these words, it is a revelation. Raised in the sun-drenched, idyllic world of Southern California and sheltered by her conservative parents, she has always prided herself on doing the right thing. But in 1965, the world is changing, and she suddenly dares to imagine a different future for herself. When her brother ships out to serve in Vietnam, she joins the Army Nurse Corps and follows his path.

As green and inexperienced as the men sent to Vietnam to fight, Frankie is over-whelmed by the chaos and destruction of war. Each day is a gamble of life and death, hope and betrayal; friendships run deep and can be shattered in an instant. In war, she meets—and becomes one of—the lucky, the brave, the broken, and the lost.

But war is just the beginning for Frankie and her veteran friends. The real battle lies in coming home to a changed and divided America, to angry protesters, and to a country that wants to forget Vietnam.

The Women is the story of one woman gone to war, but it shines a light on all women who put themselves in harm's way and whose sacrifice and commitment to their country has too often been forgotten. Read the book and join our discussion!
