

A WORD FROM VICAR MADELYN

A New Chapter... Together

It is my sincere joy to finally be among you for this coming year of shared ministry! I have been looking forward to this year for a long time, and I can't wait to dream some more and serve with all of you.

I grew up in the countryside of central Iowa, around the Ames area. My younger brother and I were homeschooled by my mom from kindergarten to 12th grade, which was certainly more than a full time job for her!!! Now, she works in human services, helping women and children find stable housing. My dad is an accountant, though his true passion is farming, and he works for a local farmer doing all sorts of fun things. My brother also works full-time for that farmer, and his wife stays at home with their horses and dog. All in all, we are a close-knit family with deep connections to the soil and to our faith.

When I was little, my mom would joke that we spent almost as much time at our congregation as we did at home. I think she wasn't far off! We were involved in almost every aspect of church life, from children's ministry to youth group to worship team to finance committee. I LOVED being a church kid and that love has only grown as I have developed my call. As a high school student, I knew I wanted to work in a church. Since my home congregation was North American Baptist, I had not been exposed to women in ministry leadership except for children's ministry. I pursued that path until I saw a woman preach and introduce herself as "Pastor" at a retreat, at which point my entire world was blown apart. The thing that I had felt a call towards could actually be an opportunity for me!

In my concurrent search for a denomination and a college, I landed on Wartburg College in Waverly, IA and thus the ELCA. At Wartburg, I studied a variety of things and specialized in making worship welcoming and accessible as well as exploring ecumenical partnerships. Wartburg gave me another gift: my nowhusband, Nathaniel. He and I were classmates together and gradually fell in love at college. We got married on May 31st this year and have been happily building our new life together. Nathaniel is the vicar at Grace Lutheran Church in Knoxville, IL and we live in his parsonage in Knoxville.

The most recent chapter in my life has been seminary. I chose to attend the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago because I wanted something completely new. I certainly satisfied my appetite for big city living and was ready to be done! I have completed two years of my seminary schooling, now I am in my internship year, and then I will finish with one more year of seminary online. This year is important to my overall learning as it gives me a chance to put into practice all the academic knowledge I have been gathering. I am excited to be in a congregation and working with people of faith to achieve our mutual goals. I am confident that we will all have a great year of ministry and sharing Christ's love.
