

An Eventful Season

This summer has been full of transitions for us as a congregation. Pastor Matt, Melinda, and Abbey each concluded their ministry here at First Lutheran. We've welcomed Vicar Madelyn and Inger to our congregation. And now, we are pleased to welcome Heidi Fleming to our staff as our Interim Faithtime Director.

Heidi and her husband Adam have been members of our congregation for over 10 years. They have 4 kids – Davian (2nd grade), Deklan (Kindergarten), and Danikka and Dayla (Preschool). They live here in Geneseo with their dog, RJ. In this new role, Heidi will be responsible for directing the Faithtime Kids program each Wednesday afternoon.

Our program year has begun in earnest! We are moving forward with all the plans, despite having an open position on staff. Each of our staff members and so many committed volunteers, including the members of our newly formed Christian Education & Youth Ministry team, have stepped up to make sure that our ministry with children and youth can continue during this interim period. Trunk or Treat is a community-wide event, hosted by First Lutheran Church during Geneseo's trick-or-treat hours on October 31. Everyone is invited to make our church a stop along their trick-or-treat route. Families and kids can stop here for trick-or-treating, potty breaks, and a free hot dog and cup of hot chocolate. I want to thank Diane Olson and Loretta Dick, who have stepped up to help plan this event, and all the volunteers who will make First Lutheran a welcoming place on Halloween.

Jul Gott will return this year! For many years, First Lutheran Church hosted this fundraiser in December to benefit several hunger ministries. This year, Jul Gott (Swedish for "Christmas Goodies") will happen on Saturday, December 13 as a part of the Christmas Walk festivities. More information is coming soon!

On that same day, we will once again host an evening meal during the Christmas Walk. Jim & Mary Jo Brummet will lead a team of volunteers to host a Spaghetti Dinner on the evening on December 13. This year, all the funds raised will be used for Easter baskets this coming spring for children in foster care, in partnership with the LSSI office in Moline.

Each of these events is an opportunity for our congregation to partner with members of our community for service, fellowship, and fun. These events help us Share Christ's Love with our neighbors. As we work side by side with our brothers and sisters in Christ, old friendships are strengthened and new friendships are formed.

The story begins in 1739, on a small plantation in South Carolina. Eliza's family recently moved there from Antigua, but her father soon returns to Antigua for military duty, leaving 16-year-old Eliza in charge of their home plantation and two others they own. It was unheard of at the time to leave a woman in charge of anything, especially one as young as Eliza, and she faced plenty of sexism as she tried to run the three properties. As Eliza digs into things, she discovers that her father has mortgaged two of the properties to pay for his military commission (thank goodness you no longer have to be rich to be an officer!). This has left the family finances in a precarious position, which only gets worse with time. Eliza decides that indigo is the solution to the family's financial woes. At the time, France cornered the market on producing indigo dye – they grew the plants in some of their colonies and extracting the dye was a complicated process. All of this made indigo very lucrative. Be sure to read this incredible story of love, dangerous and hidden friendships, ambition, betrayal and sacrifice and join our discussion!

2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly Overall Reflection By Bill Westcott, reprinted from the Northern Illinois Synod

Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

I am writing to share the elements of the Churchwide Assembly that I was blessed to both attend and participate fully in with other voting members of our Northern Illinois Synod. This was my first such experience at a Churchwide event. Our team was very diverse and worked collaboratively in every facet of our decision-making process before votes were cast. That is not to say that we all voted the same way each time; in fact, our being able to agree to disagree on several main issues was, in my opinion, one of our biggest strengths.



Each day we were gathered by the Holy Spirit around the means of grace in worship, we were rooted and nourished by God's grace through Word, Sacrament, and raising our voices to the Lord. Our theme for the ELCA Churchwide Assembly was, *For the Life of the World*.

Overview of our week-long work in Phoenix, Arizona:

- Transitions occurred in two key leadership roles as the assembly voted in multiple ballots to elect our new Presiding Bishop (Bishop Yehiel Curry – Metropolitan Chicago Synod), as well as a new Secretary (Rev. Lucille "CeCee" Mills – North Carolina Synod) of the ELCA.
- The voting members were called upon to consider a new social statement: Faith and
 Civic Life: Seeking the Well-being of All. This is necessary as we continue to address
 civic engagement, the role of government, Christian nationalism, and the public
 responsibilities of rostered ministers.
- We made editorial changes to the Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust to bring the statement in line with current law and inclusive understandings of family.
- As voting members, we were also called upon to review, discuss, and consider Memorials
 and Justice Issues from throughout our synods. These included the following: missing
 and murdered Indigenous women, Indian boarding school remembrance, Israel-Palestine
 and ending occupation, end-of-life decisions, and restoration of USAID funding. A large
 part of our deliberations was centered around racism and church reform.
- The Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church (CRLC) presented a report examining the ELCA's identity, purpose, and structure with a primary focus on dismantling racism. Volumes of the 800+ voting members rose to speak for or against these issues and offered amendments. Voting members of our NIS were recognized and participated in offering up amendments to several of the documents. Not all the items for consideration were achieved, because of time constraints and lack of enough votes for passage. Those not passed will be reviewed and returned to the appropriate committees for more considerations prior to voting by the ELCA Church Council. Many will return to the Churchwide Assembly in 2028 for reconsideration.

Once again, I am so thankful for the opportunity to have represented the Northern Illinois Synod at the Churchwide Assembly.
