A WORD FROM VICAR MADELYN

Lingering with Thankfulness

Fall is a season of change – changing temperatures, colors, and patterns, just to name a few! Fall is also a season of familiarity, of visiting family and hometowns as well as harvest and homecoming. In fall, we hold both the familiar and the changing with thankfulness, especially as we celebrate Thanksgiving and the end of the church year.

A familiar thing that I have come to love here at First Lutheran is fellowship after Sunday worship, as well as the lively conversations that happen before Saturday evening worship. In both of those instances, it is so fun to engage with each other about what has been happening and what is to come in the life of the community. I love hearing updates about kids, sports teams, or craft projects; nothing is too small to be held and celebrated in this community.

One of the books I have been reading over my internship is adrienne maree brown's *Emergent Strategy*. It is a book about change, especially about the vital importance of relationships within change. One of her principles for emergent strategy is this: "Move at the speed of trust. Focus on critical connections more than critical mass – build resilience by building relationships."

Building relationships is certainly one thing that the church knows how to do. We have been commanded to love our neighbors as ourselves (Matthew 22:39), and that command leads us to pursue ways to be intentional about community. After all, Jesus said that loving our neighbors was the second most important thing, after loving God. As Lutherans, we affirm that loving others flows out of our love for God, that God gives us the love that we need to love each other. God loves us all, so we can also love all.

One of the most impactful ways that we love each other is to linger together, to be thankful together, to rejoice and mourn together. By reaching out and being honest with each other, we create the critical connections that allow us to function as the body of Christ. In sharing time, we signal that people matter more than our next task or event; people are the church. brown emphasizes that small actions grow into big actions – so what are our priorities as a congregation? How can we live into them in big and small ways?

I hope that you will linger with intentionality this month. Stay for fellowship, if that hasn't been a part of your weekend routine. Talk with the people sitting by you or the people serving with you. Show up honestly and fully. Above all, be thankful for the people around you in this season of familiarity and change.

Come and join us for discussion on the content of the book *The Lion Women of Tehran* and faith response to the author Marjan Kamali on Thursday, November 20 at 2 p.m. in Grace Place.

In 1950s Tehran, seven-year-old Ellie lives in grand comfort until the untimely death of her father, forcing Ellie and her mother to move to a tiny home downtown. Lonely and bearing the brunt of her mother's endless grievances, Ellie dreams for a friend to alleviate her isolation. Luckily, on the first day of school, she meets Homa, a kind girl with a brave and irrepressible spirit. Together, the two girls play games, learn to cook in the stone kitchen of Homa's warm home, wander through the colorful stalls of the Grand Bazaar, and share their ambitions of becoming "lion women." But their happiness is disrupted when Ellie and her mother are afforded the opportunity to return to their previous bourgeois life. Now a popular student at the best girls' high school in Iran, Ellie's memories of Homa begin to fade. Years later, however, her sudden reappearance in Ellie's privileged world alters the course of both of their lives. Together, the two young women come of age and pursue their own goals for meaningful futures. But as the political turmoil in Iran builds to a breaking point, one earth-shattering betrayal will have enormous consequences. Be sure to read this mesmerizing tale of love and courage, and a sweeping exploration of how profoundly we are shaped by those we meet when we are young.
